In March, to control the spread of the virus, Honduras entered into a lockdown. As many of our patients at CCSHH came from the surrounding areas and transportation became almost impossible, our clinic was forced to close.



For three months. our clinic staff worked diligently in setting high standars for care by obtaining PPE for the staff, installing portable handwashing sinks, and putting in place strict policies when patient care was to begun again. We fortunately started back clinic operations in June but continue to follow strict guidelines for providing care.
